

## Assistant Professor of Dance and Movement Studies

The Department of Dance and Movement Studies at Hamilton College invites applications for a tenure track position at the rank of Assistant Professor, beginning July 1, 2024. We seek candidates to teach elementary, intermediate, and advanced Contemporary Dance, Composition, Choreography, and Laban Movement Analysis, and to choreograph works for departmental performances. In particular, we are seeking candidates who can contribute courses to diversify the College's dance curriculum and can demonstrate their experience in teaching or working with diverse student populations. Your cover letter should address ways in which you raise issues of diversity and inclusion in your teaching, scholarship, and/or service and the ways in which this enhances the educational experiences of students. The position requires institutional service including academic advising of department concentrators after the first year.

The creative process is at the core of Hamilton's Dance and Movement Studies program, which focuses equally on performance and scholarship. Theory-based courses, which cover a spectrum of disciplines and styles, explore the human body from physiological, psychological, anthropological, historical, and philosophical points of view. Faculty emphasize ideas, imagination, problem-solving, spontaneity, discipline, cooperation, and commitment. Students enjoy ample opportunities to work alongside our instructors and guest choreographers and independently on directing, choreographing, performing and producing.

Candidates with a MFA, Ph.D, or equivalent degree are strongly preferred; ABD will be considered. The teaching load for this position is four courses during the first year and five courses thereafter. The expected salary range for this position is \$88,000 to \$94,100.
