# It is best practice to carry the following documents with you when you are traveling in the U.S.:

- 1. A valid passport (at all times)
- 2. Your current U.S. visa
- 3. Your I-20 form with a valid signature (for international students, i.e., students currently enrolled in an institution located in the United States)
- 4. Confirmation of your registration to attend the DSA 2025 Conference and/or a DSA 2025 name badge (at all times)
- 5. Proof of your hotel confirmation and ability to financially support yourself in the United States (such as a letter from your current employer or bank account statement).
- 6. A return flight ticket (at all times)

While digital copies can be stored on your phone, it is strongly recommended to carry hard copies of these documents. Digital documentation is not always accepted, and presenting your digital copies on a device to a U.S. Customs and Border Protection agent makes that device subject to search.

- Be honest and transparent in your responses.
- Clearly explain the purpose of your visit and the duration of your stay.
- Remain respectful and courteous at all times.
- Remember that immigration officers may inspect your phone, laptop, or other electronic devices for information that could potentially make you excludable from the United States.

### While You Are Here

We are excited to welcome you to Washington, DC!

#### **Dining**

Western Market is a food court with a wide variety of options ranging from \$5-\$25 for breakfast and lunch and is about 10 minute walk.

**Met Cafe the Venue** is a cafeteria-style food option on the same block as the main conference venue. Located on the ground floor of the United Unions building, its an affordable and efficient eatery.

There are multiple <u>GW Campus Dining</u> options that range from \$10-\$20 within 10 minutes walking.

## Lodging

DSA has reserved a room block at <u>Yours Truly</u>. This hotel is within 20 minutes walking from all conference locations.

Hotels within 10 minutes walking to conference locations are <u>State Plaza</u>, <u>Lombardy</u>, <u>Arc Hotel</u>, and <u>Hotel Hive</u>.

#### **Transit**

Washington, DC has a safe and reliable transit system called the <u>Metro</u>, which includes rail and bus routes. Riders can purchase fare cards at rail stations and fares range from \$2.25-6.75 per ride depending on time of day and distance traveled.

The closest rail stations to the conference venue are Foggy Bottom-GWU and Farragut West, both on the Orange, Blue, and Silver lines.

<u>Visitor parking</u> is available on the GW campus. The closest garage to the main conference venue is the Elliott School Garage, which can be accessed on 19th Street between E and F Streets, NW. Note that this garage is open 7am-11pm Monday through Friday and is closed on weekends.

The Metro connects to both Dulles International Airport and Reagan National for affordable transit into the DC metro area. For those arriving or departing directly

to the conference, we will have a classroom available for locked storage of luggage.

#### Technology

The George Washington University provides free WiFi access to guests through the <u>GWguest</u> network and <u>eduroam</u>. Attendees with credentials from a university or college using eduroam can login to that network using their home institution credentials. <u>GWguest</u> is available to all attendees.

For presenters and panel chairs: AV is available for wireless connection in all classrooms and presenting spaces via Crestron Air Media. Please download to a device (laptop is recommended over a smart phone) prior to arrival; we recommend one device is used per session (i.e., please circulate all powerpoints and AV content to a central device). Once installed, connection typically takes less than 5 minutes for on-site use.

#### **Windows**

- 1. Download the Windows installation file.
- 2. Right-click on the downloaded .exe file and select "Run as Administrator".

## macOS

- 1. Download the macOS installation file.
- 2. Double-click the downloaded file to begin the installer.
- 3. See Connect to an AirMedia on a Mac Laptop for connectivity instructions.
