Widely regarded as the world's largest library, the Library of Congress welcomes scholars and faculty and dance writers of the Dance Studies Association who would like to explore the vast holdings in dance, community arts, design, cultural studies, and more.

Come visit a **five-table curated exhibit of materials** found amongst the AFC and Music collections, representing noted anthropologists, choreographers, designers, photographers, and more. Papers, artwork, choreographic notes, music, and moving images are among the Treasures that will be available. Meet some of the archivists and librarians who are ready to help you with your research, and stay to chat with colleagues at table available to visitors to the exhibit.

Arrive early! Do some research! Get a Library of Congress Reader's Card!

To use any of the Library of Congress reading rooms, the visitor must have a LOC card with photograph. It's fast to get one onsite, especially if you pre-register ahead of arriving using the link below. The Music Division/Performing Arts Reading Room (PARR)) and the American Folklife Center (AFC) will have **staff available before the conference starts** - **8:30** a.m. **to 5** p.m. **Monday through Wednesday, June 23 – 25** - in their reading rooms to assist researchers in using the extensive dance-related collections and recordings housed at the Library of Congress.

<u>Pre-Register for your Reader's Card</u>: It will only take a few minutes if you pre-register and have ready your government-issued ID (driver's license or passport are good) when you arrive at the **Reader's Registration station** in the Newspaper Reading Room (**LM-133, Madison building**).

Music Division and Performing Arts Reading Room (PARR), **research orientation**, **10 a.m. Monday**, **June 23**, hosted by Dr. Libby Smigel, dance curator, LM-113, Madison Building. Appointments at other times or days can be arranged by contacting the Reference Librarians of the PARR by the <u>Ask-a-Librarian</u> interface. If you want to reserve a timeslot, you can make a reservation <u>here</u>.

American Folklife Center is open 8:30 – 5 p.m. Monday to Friday, and you can contact the AFC reference librarians in advance with this <u>interface</u>. Information about other reading rooms and contacts for subject specialists can be found <u>here</u>. Letting us know in advance what your research plans are and times you want to visit will help us help you!

Getting to the Library of Congress: James Madison Building/Library of Congress, 101 Independence Avenue, S.E., Washington, D.C. (the square marble building facing Independence Ave. between First and 2nd Streets, S.E.) Note that visitors and researchers enter through an airport-like security screening. Travel light! Or check your bags at the **coat and bag check** nearby (LM-140) after the security check. This building is **accessible.**

Closest subway stop: 1. Capitol South (blue/orange/silver) is a block away from the Library entrance; Union Station (red line) is a 17- to 20-minute walk past the Supreme Court, Capitol, and Jefferson Building on First (1st) Avenue S.E.
